
### MESSAGE FROM THE CHANCELLOR

t is with great pleasure and honor that I welcome you to the **20<sup>th</sup> Graduation Ceremony of Kabarak University**. I sincerely thank you for honoring our invitation to grace this occasion.


Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, today we have more reasons to celebrate as we are graduating a record **2,541** candidates who have successfully completed studies in various academic programs in this University. This is the highest number so far to graduate from this University, an increase of **36%** from last year. This increase is the result of the growth of new market-driven programs we have developed in recent years. It is also a reflection of the confidence and trust that our students and parents have in the quality of holistic and world-class education we offer at Kabarak University.

#### **New Programs**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, the University has realized significant progress throughout 2024. In the development of new programs, a notable achievement lies in our newest Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) programs that have been approved by the Commission for University Education. These programs are: Master of Pharmacy in Oncology Pharmacy, which we have launched in September 2024; Master of Science in Artificial Intelligence and Bachelor of Science in Data Science and Analytics, which we will launch in January 2025. In the Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences, our new programs are: Postgraduate Diploma in Mass Communication, which we launched in May 2024; Bachelor of Counseling Psychology, which we launched in September 2024; and Master of Arts in English Language and Linguistics, which we will launch in January, 2025.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, we mounted the Master of Pharmacy in Oncology Pharmacy this September Semester and we have completely filled all the admission slots for the 2024 intake. I wish to express my sincere and profound gratitude to **Prof. Fredrick Chite Asirwa**, the CEO, International Cancer Institute (ICI), for joining Kabarak University in a partnership that has brought to us immense physical and human resources from ICI. The development and launch of Master of Pharmacy in Oncology Pharmacy would not have been possible without support from Prof. Asirwa and the entire team from ICI.

Hon. Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, we deliberately developed our Master of Pharmacy



in Oncology Pharmacy to support the *Government* of *Kenya Cancer Policy 2019-2030*. To this end, we have aligned our Oncology Pharmacy program to comprehensively address cancer treatment in Kenya through the systematic implementation of evidence-based interventions for prevention, screening, timely diagnosis, treatment, survivorship and palliative care, monitoring, and research.

#### Research

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, the University continues to remain vibrant in Research, Innovation and Outreach activities. This year, the University successfully hosted the 14th International Research Conference. The Conference attracted eminent national and international keynote and guest speakers from the industry, corporate world, and academia. Notable keynote and guest speakers included Dr. Donald Otoyo, Director, Permanent Presidential Music Commission; Dr. Ezekiel Mutua, CEO, Music Copyright Society of Kenya; Hon. Florence Kajuju, Chairperson, Commission on Administrative Justice; Prof. Tongi Mugoya, University of Alabama, USA; Prof. Sung Seek Moon, Baylor University, Texas, USA; and Prof. Patrick Ndungu, University of Pretoria, South Africa.

#### **Innovation**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, Kabarak University remains committed to fostering innovation and supporting student-driven initiatives. I have the evidence to support this statement, but because time is of the essence, I will only mention a few examples. Kabarak University is the proud host of an annual innovation festival known as the Central Rift Innovation Week. The event brings





together researchers and innovators from industry to focus on the commercialization of innovation.

As a precursor to the Annual Central Rift Innovation Week 2024, the University hosted the Data Innovation and Entrepreneurship Challenge 2024 on May 31, 2024. This was followed by the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Central Rift Innovation Week on September, 16-19, 2024. The theme was Data Innovation and Entrepreneurship. A total of sixty-six (66) innovators showcased their innovations, comprising 23 teams presenting data-driven solutions to real-world challenges across various thematic areas. During the week, ten (10) innovation teams were selected for sponsorship by Kenya National Innovation Agency for the Kenya Innovation Week 2024 which took place on November 25–29, 2024.

During the Kenya Innovation Week, one of Kabarak University's teams participated in a hackathon organized by the Kenya Red Cross on 26th November 2024. Out of 378 participants, our team comprising **Mercy Jemeli, Felix Masigwa, and Mercy Njeri** emerged as the overall winners. Their innovative solution earned them a cash prize and a one-year internship opportunity.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, Kabarak University this year achieved a remarkable feat by winning the 2024 ENACTUS National Championship held in Nairobi in July 2024. ENACTUS Kabarak emerged as the National Champion with an innovation dubbed ThermoSoothe, an innovative device created to alleviate the pain of sickle cell disease. ThermoSoothe combines thermal massage and air pressure technology to improve patient's quality of life. Following the success in the ENACTUS National Championship, the Kabarak University ENACTUS Team proceeded to represent Kenya in the ENACTUS World Cup 2024 held in Astana, Kazakhstan, Central Asia, to compete with the best teams from around the world. Congratulations to the Kabarak University ENACTUS Team, led by our students Cheptoo Qannick, Sylvia Gati, Patricia Njeri, Boaz Masika, and Debra Moraa.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, a well thought out story is also an innovation. **Caroline Chebet,** a second year Mass Communication student at Kabarak University, has invented a high impact story known as *Kenya talking bird, the African grey parrot faces near-extinction*. The environmental conservation invention has attracted international attention. As a result, Caroline Chebet was invited to USA to receive an award in Palo Alto, California, USA on May 16, 2024. The Prize was awarded by Internews Earth Journalism Network, a

global media development non-profit organization.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, another student worth mentioning is **Emmanuel Kipyegon Rotich**, our student pursuing Bachelor of Business Information Technology, who undertook his attachment at the Kapenguria Huduma Centre in West Pokot. During his time there, Emmanuel successfully developed a software system that streamlined the registration of persons at the Huduma Centre. According to the officers at the centre, the software significantly improved efficiency, making their work faster and more manageable. In recognition of this achievement, the Huduma Centre team from Kapenguria visited Kabarak University on October 9, 2024 to honor Emmanuel and express their gratitude to the University for nurturing such talent. Congratulations to Emmanuel Kipyegon Rotich.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, the Presidential Award Scheme is a nonformal education and learning framework through which young people's achievements outside of academia are recognized and celebrated. On October 17, 2024, Kabarak Univeristy presented seventeen (17) highly innovative students for the award of gold certificate of the Presidential Award Scheme. H.E. President William Ruto presided over the Award ceremony at State House, Nairobi. Kabarak University was declared the best university with the highest transition rate, moving from Bronze to Silver and finally, to gold nationally, among the participating institutions.

#### **Mother Language**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, one of the significant engagements in the University this year was the hosting of the 2024 International Mother Language Day. Mother language is the foundation for learning other languages. Knowledge of mother language enhances a better understanding and appreciation of a person's own culture and identity. It also enables a person to communicate with family and community members who may not speak other languages.

To conserve and promote mother language, the Kabarak University Chair on Culture and Arts in Education, in collaboration with Kenya National Commission for UNESCO, successfully hosted the 2024 International Mother Language Day Celebrations in February 2024. The two-day event started with a Pre-Conference Research Paper Presentations on Culture and Arts, followed by the Cultural Festival / Expo on the first and second day, respectively. The Chief Guest was H.E. Ambassador Gentiana Serbu, Ambassador of Romania.





#### **Global Education**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, at Kabarak University, we are ardent proponents of global education. We believe that having a global perspective in education is crucial in preparing our students to become global citizens who can thrive in any part of our interconnected world. For this reason, our Law School has gone global. This year, the University hosted the Africa Regional Round of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Edition of the John H Jackson Moot Court Competition in April 2024. The Competition was held in partnership with the European Students Law Association (ELSA) and with technical support from the World Trade Organisation (WTO). A total of fifteen (15) universities representing nine (9) African countries participated in the competition. The countries represented were: Botswana, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Lesotho, Nigeria, South Africa, Uganda, and Zimbabwe. Kabarak University made it to the final rounds held in Geneva, Switzerland, in June 2024.

Still on global education, a team from our Law School participated in the global Nuremberg Moot Court Competition on International Criminal Law held in Nuremberg, Germany, in July 2024. Our team emerged as the third best globally. Our student, **Elvis Soita Shitanda** was ranked the overall second best oralist.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, because of our passion for global education, we have extended our academic tentacles to the People's Republic of China. Following the signing of the MoU between Kabarak University and Nanjing Agricultural University in April 2024, China Association of Higher Education invited the Vice-Chancellor, the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic and Research); and the Registrar (Administration and Human Resource) to attend the China-Africa Consortium of Universities Exchange Mechanism Annual Conference, and China-Africa High-Level Dialogue on Cooperation in Education and Cultural Heritage Protection. These conferences were side events of the 2024 Summit of the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation, attended by the African Heads of States.

Our visit to China took place on September 3-10, 2024. During this visit, our delegation also visited Nanjing Agricultural University, where the President of Nanjing Agricultural University and I signed a Cooperative Agreement between Nanjing Agricultural University and Kabarak University for Chinese Language Project. This Agreement has opened the way for teaching Chinese Language at Kabarak University. Hon. Chancellor Sir, I am pleased to report today that the Chinese Language Teaching Center at Kabarak University is up and running and is operating in both the Main Campus and the Nakuru City Campus. The

pioneer class has attracted thirty (30) learners at the Main Campus and fourteen (14) at the Nakuru City Campus. We acknowledge the presence of our able Chinese Language Instructor, **Ms. Lin Qingru**, in this Congregation.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, a similar development has taken place between the University and Germany in which we have signed the Collaboration Agreement with Akdogan Glaszner German School. The Agreement has paved the way for teaching German Language at Kabarak University. Thirty (30) students have already enrolled and ready to start classes in January 2025. We recognize the presence of **Mr. Kerem Akdogan**, Director, Akdogan Glaszner German School

Hon Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, our initiative to offer Chinese and German cultural and language programs at Kabarak University is a great opportunity that will greatly support our students and staff in particular and Kenyans in general seeking to pursue further studies, job opportunities, or business ventures in those countries. In addition to United Kingdom and Australia, where a sizable number of our nursing graduates have found greener pastures, the People's Republic of China and the Federal Republic of Germany are primed to become major destinations for our graduates.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, I am also pleased to report the strong ties we have developed with two reputable universities in the United States of America, namely Millersville University in Pennsylvania and Indiana University, Bloomington. With Millersville University, we have signed the Memorandum of Understanding and Articulation Agreement which will facilitate faculty and student exchange, research engagements, and academic staff development activities.

With Indiana University, our Department of Public Health in the School of Medicine and Health Sciences is already in partnership with the School of Public Health, Indiana University. Through the partnership, we have this year conducted a comprehensive needs assessment for community health improvement gaps in Kericho, Nakuru, and Baringo Counties. Improvement plans including development of curriculum for capacity building for the community health workforce at different levels is currently being worked on jointly by our two institutions. When completed, this project will greatly enhance public health service delivery in the three counties.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, Kabarak University is also in collaborating with two of the leading universities in the continent, namely the University of Ibadan, Nigeria, and the

University of Venda, South Africa. In these partnerships, we have active student and faculty exchange programs, joint research activities and shared engagements. A concrete example is a student from Nigeria, **Kadupe Oyewale Sofola**, currently pursuing PhD in Music at Kabarak University with full support from the University of Ibadan.

Still on the global education, we have negotiated the MoU with *Internews Europe*. Under the MoU, *Internews Europe* has already conducted digital media literacy training for journalism students and staff in our Department of Mass Media. The objective of the training and mentorship was to give young journalists and students practical tools they can apply to critically assess whether the content they are consuming and using is factual or disinformation. Our students and staff were also trained on digital safety awareness to help prevent, mitigate and respond to online attacks. We are honored to have in this congregation **Ms. Fatuma Sanbur**, Internews Regional Program Manager, East and Southern Africa Region.

#### **Partnerships**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, apart from our involvement at the global stage, we are also building collaborations and partnerships with industry and peer universities in Kenya to ensure our graduates are well grounded and prepared for the 21st century market place. In this regard, in July this year, we entered into a collaborative research agreement with the University of Nairobi (UoN) and University of California, San Francisco, to partner in a project titled: ENabling Girls in Al and Growing Expertise (ENGAGE) in Data Science. Under the agreement, fifteen (15) girls reported to Kabarak University on August 4, 2024 to start their fourweek training in Data Science, Artificial Intelligence, and Machine Learning. The students successfully completed the pilot program and graduated on August 30, 2024. We were privileged to host the hybrid graduation for a total of ninety (90) students in the same pilot program involving five (5) other universities. We have received encouraging reports from the students sharing their experience of how the project has opened more opportunities for them to work with data in the public health sector. We are honored to have in this congregation **Prof. Julius Oyugi**, Principal Investigator ENGAGE in Data Science Project and Director of Research, University of Nairobi Institute of Tropical and Infectious Diseases.

Hon. Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, we all know that mental health has become a serious national concern placing a heavy burden on the country's health system and social-economic development. To play our part in addressing this challenge and to support the *Kenya Mental Health* 

Action Plan (2021-2025), the University has entered into the MoU with Kenya Universities Professional Counsellors Association (KUPCA) in which the University and the Association are partnering to further the advancement of quality mental health provision in Kenya as well as to enhance teaching, research, innovation and outreach activities at the University. We are greatly privileged to have in this congregation **Dr. Catherine Amulundu**, Chair, Kenya Universities Professional Counsellors Association.

Hon. Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, education that integrates relevant practical skills is integral to the Mission of Kabarak University. It is our conviction that our students stand to benefit greatly from exposure to real-world applications and industry challenges. For this reason, the University has entered into the MoU with Pixel Engineering Africa Ltd and Parpus Limited in which the University and the two institutions will work together to identify and nurture early career path-finders in advanced technologies integration. We are pleased to have in this congregation **Eng. Levy Masibo**, Director of Business Development, Pixel Engineering Africa Ltd; and **Mr. Eric Mutuku**, CEO, Parpus Ltd.

#### **Engagement with Other Stakeholders**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, I will give you a brief glimpse of our fruitful engagement with stakeholder. One of the distinctive of Kabarak University is the Kabarak University Press. Established in 2022, the Kabarak University Press stands as testament to our commitment to advancing the academy in Africa through rigorous peer review, independent board approval process, publication and dissemination of academic manuscripts. This year, Kabarak University Press won a contract from the Anti-Counterfeit Authority of Kenya to publish a book titled *Anti-Counterfeit and Intellectual Property Law and Policy*. The book has been published to the satisfaction of ACAK.

Also Within this year, Kabarak University Press published and launched the book titled *Judicial Financial Independence in Africa*, edited by Dr. Conrad Bosire. The book is the product of the funding contract that we signed with Konrad Adenauer Stiftung. The launch, presided over by the Chief Justice Martha Koome, took place during the Summit of the African Judges and Jurists Forum held on September 17, 2024 in Nairobi. This is the sixth book the Kabarak University Press has published since its inception, in addition to five (5) journals.

Owing to our prolific publications, the Council of Legal Education has commended the Kabarak University School of Law for emerging as one of the finest research intense law schools in Kenya and Africa.





CLE has affirmed our University Press as the leading powerhouse for student publications in Kenya which publishes internationally recognized journals. To quote CLE, "Kabarak Law School is increasingly becoming a preferred research destination for jurisprudence and legal research in its niche domain."

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, still on our engagement with key stakeholders, I am pleased to mention that the National Steering Committee for the Implementation of the Alternative Justice Systems (AJS) Policy chaired by Hon. Justice Prof. Joel Ngugi, Judge of the Court of Appeal of Kenya, hosted the 2024 AJS Conference at Kabarak University on June 4-7, 2024. The Chief Justice, Hon. Martha Koome, officially opened the Conference. Participants included the big wigs from the Judiciary, including the Deputy Chief Justice of Uganda, Supreme Court Judges, Court of Appeal Judges, Judges from the High Court, and representatives from various religions and civil society groups.

We also recently engaged with the Executive arm of Government when Hon. Mercy Kiiru Wanjau, Secretary to the Cabinet, paid a courtesy call to the Vice-Chancellor and proceeded to deliver a public lecture at our Law School on November 8, 2024 on the topic: Key Insights on the Workings of the Cabinet.

#### **University Ranking**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, we celebrate Kabarak University for consistent ranking among the top ten universities in Kenya. In the first *Times Higher Education Sub-Saharan Africa University Ranking* in 2023, Kabarak University was in **position 4** in Kenya. In the *Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2024* issued on October 9, 2024, Kabarak University was ranked **6**<sup>th</sup> **best** university in Kenya. Recently, the *Times Higher Education World Sub-Saharan Africa University Rankings 2024* issued on November 27, 2024 placed Kabarak University in **position 7** in Kenya and **54** in Africa.

## Our Bachelor of Science in Nursing is the Best Nationally

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, in the April 2024 Nursing Licensure Examination offered by the Nursing Council, Kabarak University emerged overall best among the universities offering Bachelor of Science in Nursing programs. We scored five (5) distinctions out of nine (9) distinctions nationally. Kabarak registered 72 candidates and had a Pass rate of 87.5%.

#### **Staff Professional Development**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, to keep on the cutting edge, we have facilitated various cadres of our staff to gain exposure and experience in relevant training workshops. For instance, we have had training engagements with external entities such as Microsoft Leap in partnership with Microsoft Africa Development Center, Global Nursing Leadership Institute, Data Science Africa Summer School and Workshop, Commission for University Education, Microsoft Africa Development Centre, to name just a few.

Internally, we have offered faculty development training programs focusing on pedagogical training, scientific and ethics review in research supervision, research grant proposal writing, competency based education, and cloud computation. We conduct internal training through our Directorate for Excellence in Learning and Teaching, the Institute of Postgraduate Studies, and the Directorate of Research, Innovation and Outreach. In both external and internal training workshops, we have achieved a more enriched teaching, learning and research environment, fostering academic excellence across various disciplines.

#### **Staff Promotion**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, Kabarak University recognizes and awards staff who exemplify academic, professional, and service excellence. To this end, the University conducts regular staff reviews and promotes staff on merit. This year, the University successfully reviewed and promoted fourteen (14) members of staff. Two of them rose to the rank of Professor, three became Associate Professors, two were promoted to Senior Lecturer level, and seven rose to the Lecturer position.

Our two new Professors are Prof. Fredrick BJA Ngala (Professor of Education Management and Leadership) and Prof. Gladys Jerobon Kiptiony (Professor of Counseling Psychology). The three new Associate Professors are Prof. Patrick Kibati (Associate Professor of Finance), Prof. Pamela Kimeto (Associate Professor of Nursing), and Prof. Peter Rugiri (Associate Professor of Pure Mathematics).

#### **Competency-Based Education (CBC)**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, we are positioning the University to be CBE compliant and ready for the CBC cohort expected in 2029. As a University offering Teacher Education Programs, we have revised and submitted to the Commission for University our Bachelor of Education (Arts) and Bachelor of Education (Science) programs. On October 16, 22024, CUE carried out the site inspection for those programs and were satisfied that we have revised and aligned the curricula of the programs to CBE requirements and that we have in





place academic resources that meet the minimum requirements for implementation of the curriculum.

#### **Upgrade of Facilities**

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, the University commenced the construction of the twin building with two levels of floors in 2018 as an addition to the building facilities in the School of Law. Today I am quite pleased to report that we have completed the construction and furnished the twin buildings for the School of Law to international standards. The new buildings provide plenty of room for lecture theatres, auditoriums, moot courts, and offices.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, we are cognizant of the fact that physical exercise reduces anxiety and depression, prevents and helps manage stress, and promotes mental well-being. For this reasons, the University has this year carried out a major refurbishment of the Main Campus sports facilities, including the hockey pitch, basketball pitch, tennis court and race course track. We have also done similar refurbishment in basketball and tennis courts in our Nakuru City Campus.

As a result of the upgrade of the sports facilities, there has been a tremendous rise in the number of students participating in various sporting activities. Consequently, our students have done very well in sports throughout the year. For example, our Chess Ladies, Men's Football, Rugby, Karate, and Badminton teams have reached national levels and clinched position one nationally.

To increase water supply, we have drilled two additional boreholes with a yielding capacity of 15 square cubic meters. The project is complete with two elevated tanks for distribution of water to the main storage. The newly drilled boreholes have further increased water supply, thus significantly reducing the cost and resolving the water shortage.

To enhance safety and security, we have constructed walkways for pedestrian traffic, installed carports for university vehicles and senior management staff. To continue the legacy of our Founder, we are actively involved in environmental conservation. This year, we have done tree planting in various areas across campus.

Honorable Chancellor, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, in our journey to becoming a smart campus, we have upgraded the core and distribution network infrastructure. Distribution switches with capacity to carry traffic up to 10G have been deployed at each fiber terminal points within the University. To improve users' campus Wi-Fi experience, we have upgraded the wireless access points with more advanced devices at key locations around campus.

#### **Student and Spiritual Affairs**

In students and Spiritual Affairs, the paramount focus on the holistic education has taken centre stage in the University. Initiatives promoting student well-being, personal growth and career readiness have flourished. We have been very deliberate in the implementation of mentorship programs, counseling services, and weekly spiritual nourishment services. The integration of spiritual affairs into campus life has fostered a sense of community and peaceful campus environment, instilling moral values that extend beyond academic pursuits and campus life into a life-style.

#### Gratitude

Distinguished ladies and gentlemen, before I conclude my remarks, I wish to express my sincere and profound gratitude to our Honorable Chancellor, the University Board of Trustees, and the Governing Council. The milestones we have realized this year would not have been possible without the tremendous support and focused leadership we continue to receive from the Chancellor, the Board of Trustees, and the Governing Council.

Likewise, we owe a huge debt of gratitude to the hospitals, namely PCEA Chogoria Hospital, AIC Kapsowar Hospital, AIC Kijabe Hospital, AIC Litein Hospital, AGC Tenwek Hospital, Kenyatta National Hospital, Moi Teaching and Research Hospital, and various County Referral and Teaching Hospitals for opening their doors to partner with us in providing clinical sites for our medical and pharmacy programs. In the same vein, we are forever grateful to MedSend for supporting students in our Master of Medicine in Family Medicine program. We are equally grateful to the Ministry of Health and the various county governments for sponsoring students in the program.

We are equally grateful to you our parents and guardians for supporting your sons and daughters to pursue their dreams in this University. We value your partnership and trust.

To our graduating class, I say to you what I always say to our graduating class. Words are not enough to express my appreciation. You have made us proud with your unrelenting pursuit of education, your commitment to the high standard of Biblical Christian values, and your enduring resilience. You have demonstrated discipline and commitment to excellence in your academic pursuit. I am proud of you and convey to you my warmest congratulations and best wishes from the bottom of my heart. You have a bright future. God bless you our graduates; God bless you our parents, guardians, and sponsors. God bless Kabarak University.

#### **PROFILE**

Amolo Odinga was appointed Africa Union High Representative for Infrastructure Development in Africa, a position he held until February 2023. From 2008 to 2013, Hon. Odinga was the Prime Minister of the Republic of Kenya. He had been a Member of Parliament since 1992. Today, he leads one of Kenya's most prominent political parties, Azimio La Umoja One Kenya Alliance.

Besides his career in politics, Hon. Odinga is also a successful entrepreneur, having founded the flagship

family business, East Africa Spectre, a manufacturer of gas cylinders for Kenya and the East African region.

Over the past five decades, Hon. Odinga has dedicated his life and career to improving people's lives through service to Kenya, Africa, and the world. He is a peacemaker and mediator in African and global conflicts.

In the 1990s, he worked closely with the International Republican Institute to broker peace in Mozambique and Burundi. In February 2011, he was appointed Special Peace Envoy of the African Union following the post-election crisis in Côte d'Ivoire. He also served as an election observer in several countries, including Nigeria and Zimbabwe.

Hon. Odinga is a global statesman and pan-Africanist who believes in an African continent that holds the keys to a prosperous global future with its immense natural and human resources. He promotes African sovereignty, economic prosperity, independence, stability, and security.

Hon. Odinga also champions African integration through infrastructure, commerce, and the free movement of Africans across borders, as well as an advocate for Africa's geopolitical interests, values, and Ubuntu. He is a political visionary, entrepreneur, organizational and institutional mobilizer, author and thought leader.

Hon. Odinga has represented Africa at various international forums and summits and articulated African perspectives on multiple issues, including trade, development, climate change, peace and security. His participation in these global events has helped to amplify African voices and concerns on the international stage.

Hon. Odinga has received honours and recognition for his various roles, including an honorary Doctor of Letters from the University of Nairobi for restoring peace to Kenya following the 2007 elections.
